ANOTHER AMONG THE RESPECTED OLD
CITIZENS HAS DEPARTED THIS LIFE.

Philip C. Palmer, of Bradtville, died
on the morning of March 28th and was

buried on the 29th in the cemetery
back of the brick school house. The
funeral services were conducted by
Josiah Phillips, pastor of the Baptist
church of Wyalusing.

The deceased was born in the town
of Chatham, Columbia, Co. N. Y., on
the 25th day of Jan., 1816.

When he was twelve years old, his
father moved his family to Tompkins
Co. When 21 years of age he went to
Chautauqua County, where he united
with the regular Baptist church, in
1840. Married Miss Angeline Bradt,
Feb 16, 1841. In 1847 they moved to
Wisconsin, then a Territory, and settled
in what is now the town of Wyalusing,
where he has lived up to the time of
his death.

OBITUARY.

PALMER.—Died, in Sherman N. Y. June 26th, 1869, Chloe Palmer, wife of Elder W. Palmer, in the 77th year of her age.

Sister Palmer was born in Chatham, New York Dec. 10th, 1792. She experienced religion when 27 years of age, and was baptized by Elder Edward H. Peavy, and joined the Christian church in Chatham. She moved to Chautauqua county N. Y., in 1831 and was one of the five in the organization of the Christian church in Sherman. She was a faithful laborer in the vineyard of the Lord. In ten years she traveled eleven thousand one hundred and twenty-five miles, and labored with him in persuading men to seek the Lord. Saints rejoiced, and sinners wept and cried for mercy when they heard her earnest exhortations. But her warfare is ended, and she is at rest. She leaves an aged companion and three sons, with a large number of relatives and friends to mourn her loss. The funeral was attended June 28th. Sermon by the writer, from a text of her own choice—Rev. 21, vii.

IN WONDER. —

—Rev. Samuel H. Morse of Dewittville died Thursday morning of apoplexy. He worked on his land all the preceding day, but early in the evening he was stricken and only lived a few hours. The funeral was held at 10 o'clock Thursday. The body was taken to East Springfield, Erie County, Pa., for burial. Rev. Mr. Morse was about 60 years old and had been pastor of the Christian Church of Dewittville most of the time for 25 years. He was Supreme Chaplain for the Eureka Aid Society and President of the Eureka Aid at Dewittville; also an active member of R. T. of T.
